Requirements:

MD Curriculum requirements:

- Complete the Racism in Medicine selective in the M1 or M2 year
- Complete a relevant JEDAI selective during the M1 or M2 year
- Identify a Capstone mentor and complete a project with focus on JEDAI
- Complete the required number of diversity education sessions (5 hours) in M1 and M2 year
- Complete required service learning hour during M1-M2 years (35 hours), M3 (30 hours), M4 (20) in JEDAI related service projects
- Complete 2 electives within the M3-M4 years
 - o global or "glocal" health elective
 - o community health outreach elective
 - o additional long-term (40+) volunteer service activity (approved by JEDAI committee)
 - o other underserved clinical activity (approved by JEDAI committee)

Additional/MD Co-curricular requirements:

- Record service reflections in a journal
- Complete addition 50 hours of service across M1-M4 years (diversity council or CRC board work may fulfill up half of this time with permission)
- Submit a blog post for the ODCA website, CMSRU newsletter, or Center for Humanism newsletter on a JEDAI topic of choice
- Review patient story narratives from CRC for posting in EPIC
- Submit capstone project for poster/abstract/oral presentation at regional or national conference or submit manuscript for publication
- Prepare and deliver a presentation on a JEDAI topic for the required CMSRU diversity education series
- Begin summer JEDAI research between M1 and M2 year
- Submit brief narrative summary of their service-related year in review and goals for the year ahead M1-M3 years)

Courses/Activity Descriptions:

Mentor Responsibilities

- Provide guidance to the student in their service learning opportunity search
- Meet with the student in person once per semester to reflectively discuss service learning experiences and impact
- Assist the student in creating a JEDAI project plan that is novel or enhances existing programming/services/or knowledge base
- Provide email correspondence to the student during the year as they work through their concentration experiences (community service/clinical/elective)

Student Responsibilities/Timeline

Year One—(or beginning of second year of medical school)

- Explore your interest through selectives and service learning experiences
- Apply for the concentration (due by end of M1 year)
- Meet with concentration lead faculty to discuss service learning experiences, concentration requirements and mentor search
- Begin service learning and reflective writing in journal (journal entries required only during M1 year)
- Complete required diversity education sessions
- Submit Spring semester year 1 service summary/reflection
- Consider summer service work with Bridging the Gaps, or others should consult with concentration lead faculty

Year Two

- Continue service learning (submit volunteer tracking forms, yearly reflections, mentor meeting forms)
- Identify and begin meeting with mentor to discuss service or other JEDAI experiences, assess and consider project focus
- Present JEDAI topic of choice to CMSRU students (presentation needs prior approval from Sue Liu)
- Submit year 2 service summary/reflection

Year Three

- Complete Clinical/Elective Experiences (we need to iron out what these would be new electives,
- Continued service learning requirements
- Begin review of CRC student submissions of "patient stories" for inclusion in EPIC
- Submit year 3 service summary/reflection

Year Four

- Final capstone project proposal due to JEDAI faculty council for approval (July so that feedback and resubmission is possible)
- Notification on "on track" for graduation with "Concentration in JEDAI" for MSPE letters (August/September)
- Fulfill project proposal plan
- Complete service hours and reflections
- Submit final service summary/reflection
- Complete Clinical/Elective experiences
- Final capstone project paper due (March)
- Capstone project presentations (April)
- Concentration leads notify Registrar of Completion of JEDAI (April)
